

Did You Know?

In 1885 William Astor donated 5 acres of land in Astor Park to serve as a cemetery for the towns of Astor and Astor Park. In the mid-1970's the Tatum family made a generous donation of 3 acres of adjoining property, which brought the total cemetery size to its present 8 acres. Since 1885 the cemetery has served as the final resting place for residents of Astor and Astor Park. And, since that time a small group of unpaid volunteers from throughout the community have donated their time and effort to maintain the cemetery grounds in a beautiful condition.

There is no cost to Astor/Astor Park residents for a burial or urn plot in the cemetery. All that is asked is a nominal donation to partially offset the cost of fuel and maintenance of cemetery equipment, maintenance of foliage and for the cost of miscellaneous repairs. The remainder of funds needed to operate the cemetery come from an annual fundraising breakfast and a donation drive held in the early part of each year

Your generous donations to the Astor/Astor Park Cemetery is sincerely appreciated. You can be assured that all funds donated are used to keep the cemetery in a condition that all community residents can be proud of.
